Approval of February Minutes

Updates from Advancement

Aurore Giguet

- There was a good turn-out of students and alumni at the thesis parade and hot dog event. Alumni Relations gave out over 1,000 hot dogs in two hours.
- The improved Sports Center is scheduled to open ahead of schedule this August. Access has been limited since the roof collapse in 2021. The Alumni Relations office has been advocating for access to again be extended to alumni.
- The VP for Advancement candidates will be on campus the second and third week of May. The Alumni Relations office has requested that if a candidate is finalized by Reunions that they are asked to attend.
- Reunions and Alumni College reservations are open now and are ahead of where they were last year. Meal tickets need to be purchased by May 23 to minimize unused food and budget. Last year there were a lot of unused meals.
- Reed on the Road will be in Boston and New York. This year Reed on the Road was split into different months to accommodate the faculty presenter's schedule.
- Alumni Relations is working with faculty on a multi-year HUM110 book club following the current syllabus which will have access to recorded lectures and library readings and

- also include an annual conference with faculty. Hoping to be able to open registration in the summer. This is an idea which came out of FAR last fall.
- Alumni Relations is working with Public Affairs to improve alumni webpages. The four
 most recent approved Alumni Board meeting minutes will be accessible on this webpage.
- Laurels distribution has moved from the Registrar's office to Alumni Relations. This wonderful week-long tradition of honoring graduating students with a laurel wreath now welcomes them into the alumni community.

Updates from Alumni Trustees

Tina Sohaili-Korbonits

- The Board of Trustees meeting was held on April 20.
 - o Enrollment, admissions and retention were discussed.
 - Substantial progress is being made on the campaign, and an advisory committee
 has been formed and met. It includes former alumni trustees Christine Lewis and
 Darlene Pasienscy, and current alumni trustee Carla Beam.
 - The board approved the AY2024-25 budget of \$217M, which assumes 1,440 students.
 - The board approved faculty appointments including 3 new faculty.
 - The board recognized Lisa Saldana as outgoing board member.
 - o alea adigweme was approved as incoming alumni trustee.
 - The board approved a resolution honoring Hugh Porter for his service to the college as vice president of College Relations for 26 years.
 - Plenary sessions:
 - Vice President of Admission and Financial Aid Milyon Trulove and a consultant gave a presentation regarding the ways Reed might better leverage financial aid and recruitment.
 - Ian Fisher asked about the government's FAFSA debacle this year
 and whether there was any conversation about starting to offer
 merit aid or sticking with need based aid. Tina said there was some
 explanation about the FAFSA situation, how it was affecting a
 range of schools, and where Reed is at with this. Merit aid was not
 discussed. In higher education, there is a changing landscape
 around aid.
 - There was a presentation by the Greek, Latin, and Ancient Mediterranean Studies (GLAM) faculty about changes within the department which are attracting more students to the major.
 - Tina will miss the next Alumni Board meeting as she will be welcoming a baby soon.

- CYA met on Saint Patrick's Day and welcomed four new members all class of '22 or '23, with great energy. Staff member Rachel recruited most of them at West Winds. Great to learn more about what they need and get fresh alumni perspectives.
