

ITINERARY

DAY ONE—¡BIENVENIDOS A LA HABANA!

- Arrive at Havana's José Martí International Airport in the early afternoon. Our welcoming team will meet you at the airport and assist with your private transfer to the hotel.
- Check in to your 4-star hotel, the Hotel Sevilla, in the heart of Old Havana with fabulous rooftop views of the city.
- Take an interactive walking tour around Old Havana, interacting with local shopkeepers, artists, and musicians.
- Adventure to Fábrica de Arte Cubano, a power plant converted into a warehouse of art and live music. It is now the most popular and eclectic curated art space and nightlife spot in Havana.
- After our private exploration of the modern exhibits, receive a special welcome reception in the private restaurant hidden in the art house.

DAY TWO—A VIEW OF THE PAST & A LOOK TO THE FUTURE

- Tour the Museo de la Revolución, which tells the Cuban story from the official government perspective.
- Tour La Corona Cigar Factory and learn the art of making their world-famous exports.
- Travel to Callejon de Hamel for a discussion on religion on the island, meeting with Santeria practitioners who will share their spiritual beliefs, music, and art.
- Enjoy lunch in a local home and learn about the ways religion impacts life in Cuba.
- Return to the hotel to prepare for our New Year's Eve celebration.
- Take a sunset drive down the Malecón in a classic convertible on the last night of the year.
 Start the night with a private salsa dance class, getting ready for the festivities ahead.
- Celebrate New Year's Eve with a feast at La Guarida, a restaurant, set in a private home, that is largely regarded as the best on the island.
- Ring in the New Year with your new friends and dance away your final night of 2020.

DAY THREE—ALL ABOUT ART

- Take a curated tour of the Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes for an overview of the history and importance of art on the island.
- Meet some of Cuba's up-and-coming artists who are preserving traditional printmaking techniques at Taller Grafica, a local graphic arts center.
- Enjoy lunch in the heart of Havana before driving to the hilltop village of San Francisco de Paula to visit Finca la Vigía, the house where Ernest Hemingway lived for 20 years.
- Visit an organic farm and learn about the public-private partnership that has kept a family business thriving.
- Explore the farm at sunset and discuss entrepreneurship in Cuba. Enjoy an evening BBQ with live cultural music and dancing, as you kick off the first night of 2021.

DAY FOUR-ADIOS NUEVOS AMIGOS

- Visit Almacenes, an expansive local art market and the perfect place to bargain for your final handmade souvenirs, or explore Havana on your own.
- Enjoy an exclusive lunch at Fusterlandia, the private home and studio of Cuban muralist and ceramist José Fúster, described as the "Picasso of the Caribbean."
- Transfer to Havana's José Martí International Airport for your return flight.

OPTIONAL EXTENSION

DAY FOUR-THE CUBAN COUNTRYSIDE

- Drive out of Havana and through Cuba's scenic countryside to Las Terrazas, the pioneering eco-village that is nestled within a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.
- Enjoy a private welcome and discussion with Fidel Hernandez, bird expert and curator of the reserve, and host to foreign presidents, poets, and all those who wish to enjoy Cuba's flora and fauna.
- Have lunch en El Campo with farm-fresh ingredients. Dine at the oldest dedicated vegetarian restaurant in Cuba, and discuss how restaurants function in a rationed food economy.
- Visit the home and studio of a local artist who takes recycled paper from the community and generates stationary, cards, and art.
- Wander through one of the country's oldest coffee plantations, with stunning views of the lush green valley and the Caribbean Sea in the distance.
- Dine at a beautiful colonial mansion along the sea this evening and reflect on the week-long adventure with your fellow travelers. Enjoy the live music and seaside dancing during our final evening together.
