Update from Reed's Risk Assessment Task Force

30 minutes Sheena McFarland

- Sheena extended thanks to Advait and Andrei for their remarks at commencement.
- Reed has memberships with the following organisations
 - National Association of Diversity Officers in Higher Education
 - National Association of College and University Business Officers
 - National Association of College Admissions Counseling
 - National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities
- Reed has signed onto the following amicus briefs and statements
 - Presidents Alliance on higher education and Immigration
 - American Association of Colleges and Universities
- We are also a part of the Small College Coalition which has hired a lobbyist
- Strategic Communications
 - Reed is engaging with Elected Officials in Oregon and beyond
 - Working with both Democrats and Republicans
 - Leveraging resources from the above mentioned organizations, building coalitions and staying informed
 - Staying within the community: messaging students, staff, faculty, alumni, and parents but not the wider public.
- Reed's Risk Assessment Task Force was convened in February and is comprised of 8 staff and 2 faculty members
 - Have identified top 14 points of exposures for Reed; selected 7 of those scenarios

- Developed a response template: lead contacts, who needs to be engaged, what is the helpful data and resources we should be paying attention to. Also identified the worst possible consequences for each.
- Developed formal response plans for each of the 7 scenarios
 - Immediate actions
 - Communications plan
 - Recovery strategies
 - Stakeholder coordination
 - Where possible outlined proactive or preventative measures
 - Policies and procedures
 - Training and awareness
 - Security and safeguards
 - Risk monitoring system
- Overall grant/federal funding at Reed
 - Total of \$5million in grants from all sources. Of this approximately \$3 million per year are federal grants
 - Indirect costs: \$500,000 from multi-year awards
 - 90% NSF, 10% NIH
 - Federal financial aid
 - Pell \$1.4 million
 - SEOG \$225,000
 - Federal Work Study \$200,000
 - Other \$200,000
 - The below loans are not held by Reed but affect our students
 - Student loans \$5.5 million
 - Family loans (unknown)
- Other evolving risks
 - Proposed federal budget
 - Reconciliation bill
 - New visa approval program
 - Investment reviews
 - Trump administration and court orders
 - Recession/General Financial/Tariffs
 - Unknown exposures
- Actual Impacts here at Reed
 - Stress and anxiety levels across campus are high
 - Large increase in referrals to the [CARE team](#)
 - No grants have been canceled
 - One sub-grant has been cancel, but another university was the PI on that grant
 - Fulbright scholars have maintained their funding

- No students have lost their visas or been deported
- What can alumni do?
 - Have a webpage on how you can help alumni
 - Reach out to your representative or senator (sample letter available)
 - Student Aid Alliance outreach
- Custodian Union
 - Reed is making a good faith effort to bargain with the custodian union
 - They have met only once so far
 - The petition and calls to action from the union are painting a deeply inaccurate story
 - Many custodians are not in support of some of the tactics being used
 - Reed currently pays custodians 20% more in wages than the market norm
 - Reed has successfully bargained with custodians in the past and will again
- Q&A and open comments
 - Q: Does Reed anticipate any issues with accreditation (like Columbia is dealing with)?
 - A: Have not been hearing anything from our accreditor. Reed does not rise to the level of Columbia at a federal level. We are aware of what's going on with other institutions' accreditation processes.
 - Q: What percentage of Reed's annual budget is represented by federal funds?
 - A: About 5%
 - AB member who works at another college has seen their accreditation organization quietly pressured and they updated some of their formal documents/statements to remove references to inclusion but without any discussions or announcement.
 - Q: Is Reed aware/worried about potential caps to student loans?
 - A: Reed students take a relatively small amount of student loans so we hope this will not greatly impact our students. However, we know that our students go on to get PhDs at a particularly high rate and it could affect Reedies post-Reed.
 - On Investment: We saw a letter from students demanding divestment from Israel. This is a complicated request but alumni were hoping for more information about why the college declined.
 - Staff can invite Erik Bernhardt, Reed' Chief Investment Officer
 - On the union issue: some concern that the bullet/talking points on this issue sound a lot like an Amazon type organization. (Andrei notes: dividing the custodian staff into good/bad 'tactics', we're in good faith — implying they're not, we pay above market — they should be grateful, we have bargained successfully before — why are they causing problems now ... these are not the kinds of things that Reed alumni are probably going to respond well to without *really* strong specific proof points that explain why this isn't just standard union busting PR)
 - These are in development as this is a new/emerging issue

- We deeply appreciate the work our custodians do and this discussion is about respect for the individuals on that team. We have had positive conversations with the teams including about the ways that we can help build community among those teams and between those teams and the rest of the college. This has historically been a challenge because they work atypical hours.
- Should there be someone from the Alumni Board at the organized union event this afternoon?
- SEIU is the union
- Alumni Board members would like to have more information and context about the issues under discussion
 - Tonality matters and how Reed navigates these union discussions will affect future union discussions that may come up (RAs, Faculty, etc.)
 - Need to fight a lot of assumptions about what kind of institution Reed is
- Custodians receive the same [healthcare and retirement benefits](#) that all staff do
- Sheena appreciates the feedback and will be passing it on
- AB members are grateful that Sheena came to talk about these issues today (yes, thank you, Sheena!)

Updates from Reed

5 minutes Aurore Giguet

- Previously reported volunteer numbers were inaccurate. As you may know we have recently gone through a CRM transition and have been working out some reporting kinks. Stay tuned for an end of year report.
- Note on engagement data:
 - We are tracking the percentage of alumni that are engaged in any mode (giving, event attendance, communications, volunteering) and are currently engaging about 25% of the total alumni legally contactable population. We will be tracking this year to year but notably the number of alumni grows year over year so we won't necessarily see increases in the engagement rate.
 - We are working on getting comparable/benchmark data from other institutions to contextualize that data
 - We do meet with the Northwest 5 consortium and notably Willamette has nearly double the number of alumni but has the same event attendance goal as Reed of 2,000 unique attendees which we are on track to meet this year.

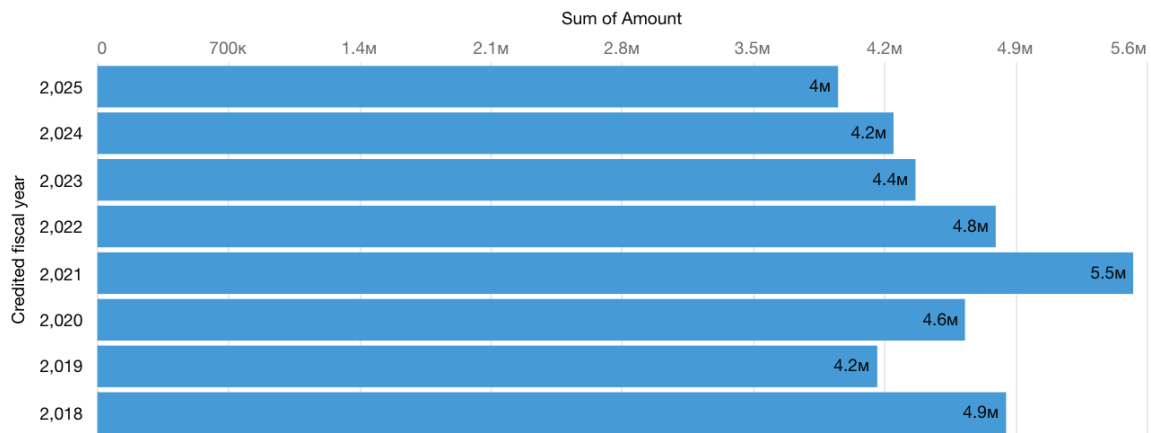

 - 47 international students - three students in our community, one current student and two incoming, are directly affected by the new travel band restrictions

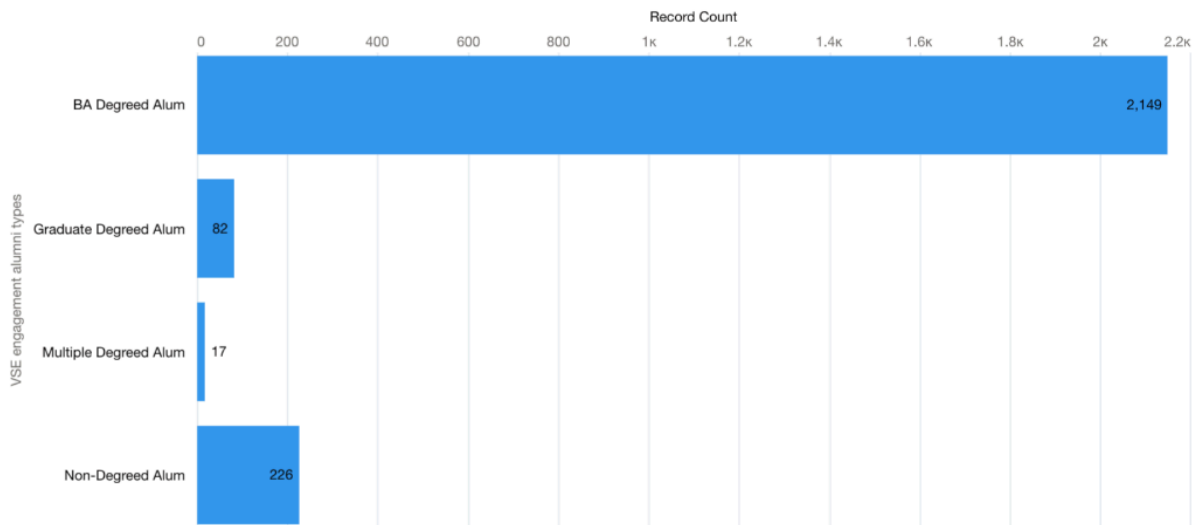

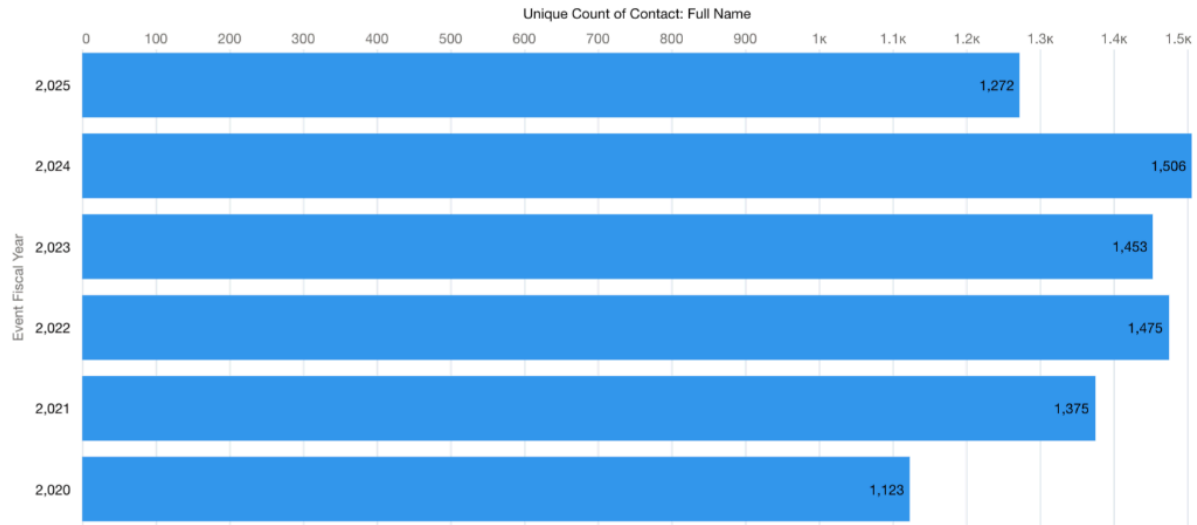

- **Looking ahead - Fall sprint**
 - Will run 10/13 (Kick-off) through 11/14 includes alumni & parent peer contacts
 - Early August session for 19 volunteers who have expressed interest to learn more
 - Each AFR volunteer will only have about 10 assigned prospects with the goal being that each prospect gets multiple contacts (goal of 5 touches) and relationships can be built.
- **Spring sprint recap (so far)**
 - We met our goal of 100% committee participation in Annual Fund Giving
 - We are a handful of communications shy of meeting the goal of 100% of committee members attempting to contact five assigned individuals/prospects.
 - So far, 60% of our conversations have resulted in prospects committing to an Annual Fund gift, while our goal was 50%.
 - Gifts from committee members and prospect assignments for the Annual Fund have resulted in nearly \$24,410 thus far (\$7,500 in prospect gifts and \$16,910 in committee gifts).
